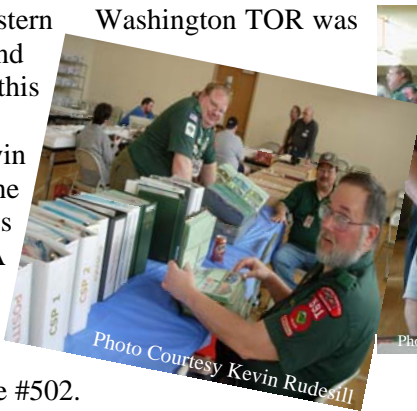

# Topical Collecting

## BIRTH YEAR COLLECTIONS

What do you do when you hit that wall in your OA or CSP collection when the pieces you need are either scarce or expensive? You want to still collect but you want to keep it interesting. You can try a topical collection.

What is a topical collection? Well the basic answer to that is collecting material that has a common link to each other.

Things such as animals (Wood Badge people love this area), Birth Year, Year you entered Scouting, Specific year collections, theme collections (star wars, bicentennial, OA 75<sup>th</sup>, etc), or all issues from a particular council (Cascade Area – all events).



I am going to start this off with a Birth Year Collection. My birth year is 1963 – the year JFK was killed. Also a year with a NOAC and a World Jamboree. Plenty of different issues for me to chase.

Cheap? Not quite. When you get to my age, people start thinking anything that old has got to be worth money. Easy to acquire – yes. At least a page full of stuff everyday to bid or buy on EBay.

Now don't let the fact that my year costs more to collect than you are willing to spend. A lot of you younger collectors can get a sizable collection of 50 plus patches for under \$50.00. I am helping my son and he already has more than I do (he was born in 1998).



Items to collect? That is up to you. I collect my birth year, all patches that refer to that year, all neckerchiefs that pertain to that year, and other memorabilia that may fit into the binder such as Boys Life Pennant, Honor Unit Pennant, and membership cards. I also have flat neckerchief slides and Boys Life Magazines.



See, it is not that hard to find things for your collection. Now to display. I currently have my items in a binder. I had a display board at the Ed Harris TOR and maybe at the NAACS. 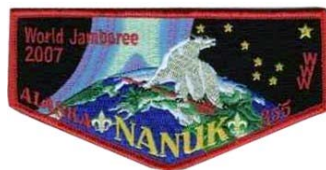

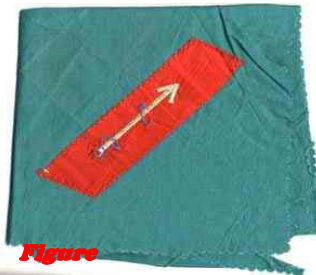

**Classic Northwest**

**Area 11B & Quilshan Treasures from the Tom Winsor Estate**

A few years ago, I acquired some of my collection's best pieces from the estate of tenured Scouter Tom Winsor. Tom was the founding member of Quilshan 325 and long time advisor for Area 11B (now W1B). He was a Silver Beaver recipient, 75 year veteran of the BSA, and recipient of the OA Distinguished Service Award. Mr. Winsor organized the first Region XI conclave in 1948, directed the first Ordeal Ceremonies for 299/502, and was a key leader in forming Area 11B (now W1B). Tom served as Area Lay Advisor while in Quilshan and Mox Kar-Po in the late 1950's and early 1960's. Section W1B honored Tom's service by naming its conclave spirit award in his name in the early 1980's. Mr. Winsor was an elementary teacher in western Washington (Deming & Forks) and retired in Ferndale before his passing in the mid 1990's.

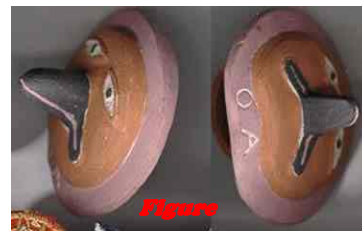
Shortly after his death, I was able to purchase the precious few items remaining in Tom's coffers. The material was amazing. Although 'the box' contained power pieces such as his distinguished service award, the uber-rare Quilshan chief's medal, and the legendary Mox Kar-Po c/e pie... the Area X1B material was the best find. 'The Box' included several interesting documents, a few patches, neckerchief slides, and staff neckerchiefs.

The 11B conclave patches are well documented on the W1B web site

([www.w1b.org](http://www.w1b.org)), so I will limit my discussion to the items that are not included in their report. First is the 1959 staff neckerchief shown in (figure 1). Over my collecting career, I have only found two examples of this killer piece. The second specimen I purchased from conclave staff member Jack Arnold (this now resides in the W1B museum). Also included in Tom's collection were staff neckerchiefs from 1964 (figure 2) and 1965 (figure 3). Note that the designs match the n/c slides.

The collection also contained two more unreported items - a ceramic n/c slide (figure 4) and an interesting name tag (figure 5). To my knowledge, this ceramic slide is not listed in any publication and was most likely issued in 1958. The 1961 name tag, along with Tom's section meeting minutes, help clear up a long standing question - what year was the 11B Camp Parsons n/c issued (figure 6)? The section web site indicates that it was made for the 1970 conclave. However, the logo on the n/c matches the 1961 slogan, the 1961 conclave was held at Camp Parsons, and Council of Chief's meeting minutes also indicate that a n/c was purchased for this conclave. Based on this information, I assert that this n/c was made in 1961 - not 1970.

The final discoveries were Quilshan items rumored to exist for many years - the Chief's medal (figure 7) and 1<sup>st</sup> annual convention ribbon (figure 8). The Caldwell medal was awarded to distinguished lodge chiefs and advisors through 1970. In a separate collection, I came across a copy of the invoice for this item; authenticating this medal as a Quilshan issue. The annual convention ribbon was given to each 'Quilshan-ite' that attended the first lodge convention in 1946.

An accumulation of this magnitude is the find of a lifetime. The collectibles are fantastic, but the section history is just as impressive. Tom's files included conclave programs from 1953 to 1967 along with pages of section correspondence and minutes from 11B council of chief's meetings. ....Frank

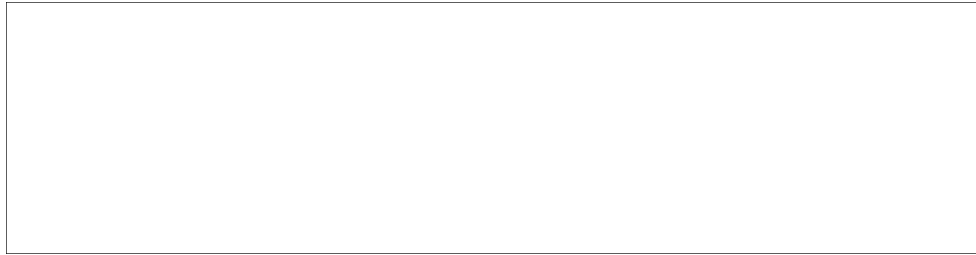
